The Albergo Diffuso Model - Maurizio Droli 2019-12-02

The hospitality model called "Albergo Diffuso" (AD), or "scattered hotel," has been engineered by Mr Giancarlo Dall'Ara and described by The New York Times as a way of bringing life back to historic towns and rural hamlets by utilizing unused rooms for tourism. This "simple but genial" model devised in Italy in the mid-90's received an award from the UNDP for its sustainability, but despite the spread of AD's, no peer-reviewed books have previously been published in English focusing on this innovation. In this book, the author therefore begins by exploring the AD as a community-based hospitality model, examining both its pros and cons. He then considers conviviality, sense of security, and other factors that Hans Magnus Enzensberger referred to as luxuries of our time for urban dwellers. These represent the key pre-requisites a location must possess to be deemed suitable for this innovation. Next, investors and co-interested private, public and not-for-profit associations are provided with a structured framework to help them achieve a defensible competitive advantage by harnessing the economic potential of valuable, rare, inimitable and non-substitutable (VRIN) resources. The final section assesses the AD as a business model, evaluating various aspects at the heart of any business plan.

Personalisation is the most relevant political phenomenon of our time. After the decline of structural and ideological foundations of Western democracies, a radical shift from collective to individual actors and institutions has occurred in several political systems. The methodology of the survey is derived in large measure from the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and these standards are applied to all countries and territories, irrespective of geographical location, ethnic or religious composition, or level of economic development.

In particolare si è dato dapprima spazio alle considerazioni inerenti la fenomenologia sistemica del Li.Me.S (Linear metropolitan system), più prossime alle tematiche sottese alla ricerca PRIN citata, per creare un sostrato su cui innestare, poi, le riflessioni di studiosi di diverse discipline, onde favorire una lettura della stessa problematica metropolitana da più punti di vista. Nei vari testi, seppur con differenti angolazioni, il connubio tra infrastrutture, architettura, ambiente, paesaggio ed economia consente una rilettura dei fenomeni di trasformazione del sistema degli insediamenti dell'area di studio, secondo visioni originali e non date, che se da un lato corona gli sforzi dell'unità locale di ricerca dell'Università degli studi di Udine, dall'altro alimenta nuove possibilità di ricerca interdisciplinare su un tema di per sé vastissimo e di grande attualità.

The mobility of health professionals affects the performance of health systems, and increasingly so since the European Union (EU) enlargements in 2004 and 2007. This publication presents research on the gaps in knowledge about the numbers, trends, impacts and policy

responses to this dynamic situation, in particular in Austria, Belgium, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Turkey and the United Kingdom.
